Thank you once again for all that you do to support our mission. I wish you and your families a peaceful and reflective autumn season.

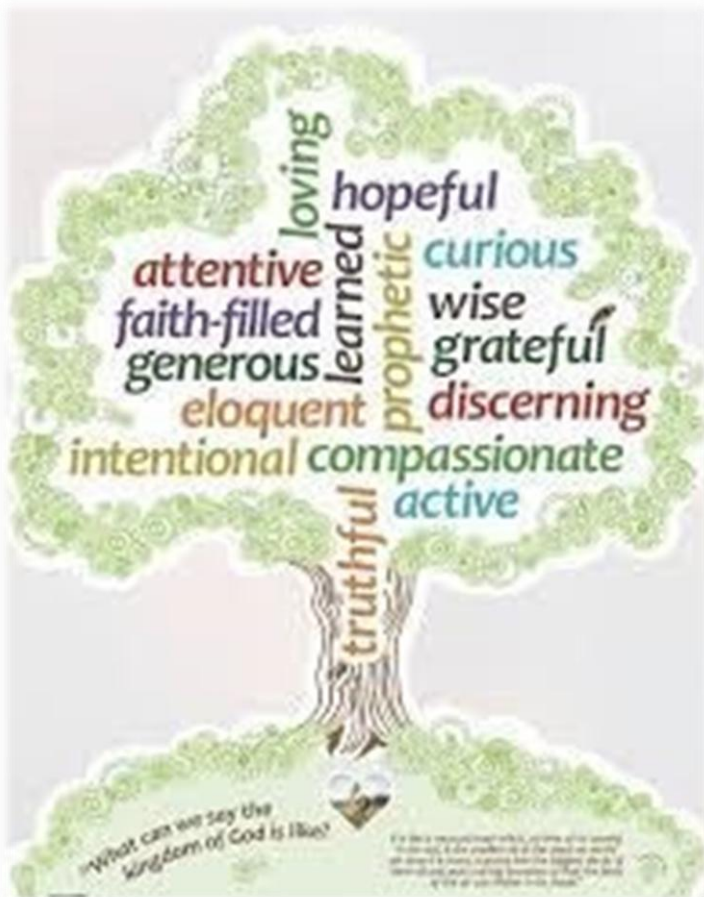

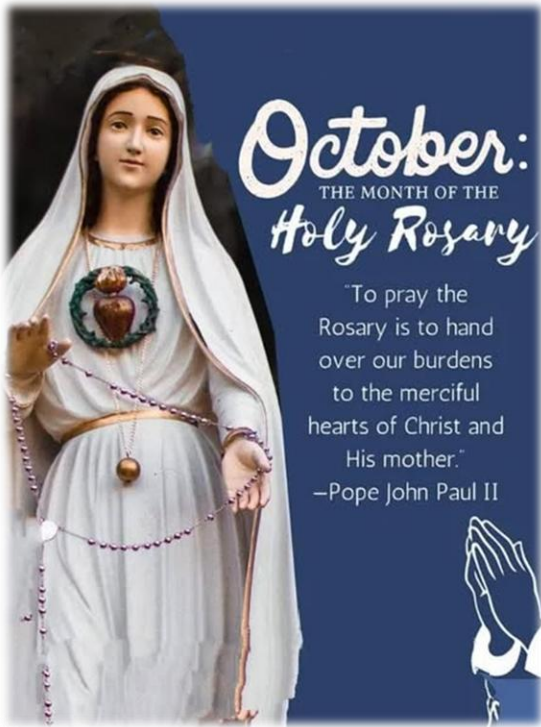

Following the assembly, children took part in classroom based activities that explored these key messages in more depth. These sessions helped children recognise trusted adults they could speak to, both in school and at home, and reinforced the importance of speaking out if they ever felt worried or unsafe.

We were proud to support this valuable programme, which helped our children build confidence, resilience, and the knowledge to protect themselves and others.

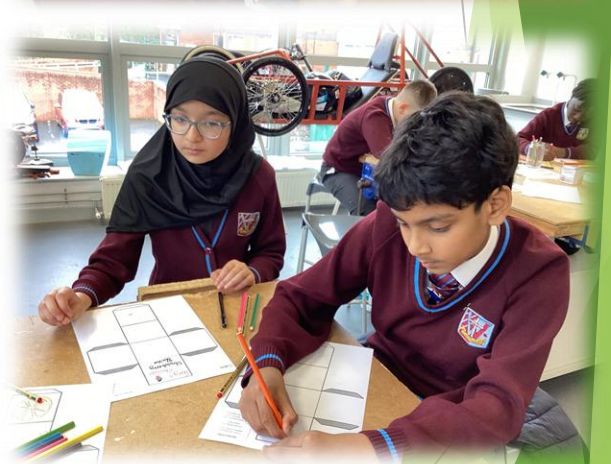
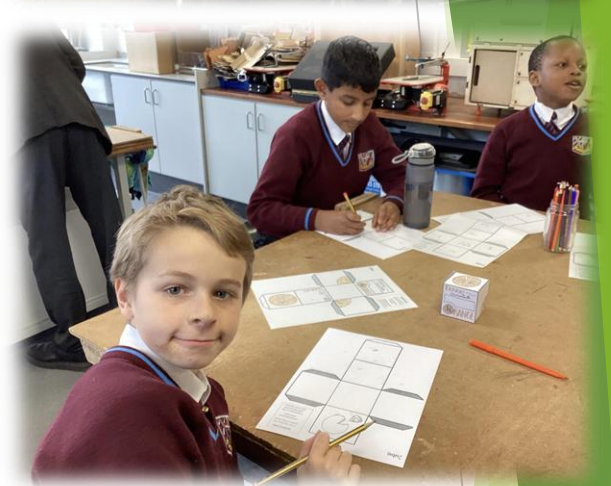

Tax Free Childcare

You can receive up to £500 every 3 months (up to £ 1,800 a year) for each of your children to help with the cost of childcare.

If you receive Tax-Free Childcare, you will need to set up an online childcare account for your child. For every £8 that you pay into this account, the government will pay £2 to use to pay your provider.

What can you use Tax-Free Childcare for?

You can use it to pay for approved childcare, for example:

- Childminders, nurseries and nannies
- After school clubs and play schemes

Eligibility

Your eligibility depends on:

- Whether you're working
- Your income (and your partner's income if you have one)
- Your child's age and circumstances
- Your immigration status

If you're self-employed, you may still be eligible.

Your Child

Your child must be 11 or under and usually live with you. They stop being eligible the first September after their 11th birthday.

Adopted children are eligible but fostered children are not.

Yes

	Until...
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

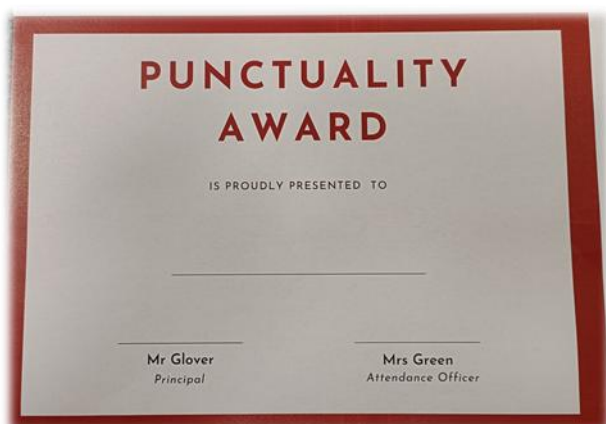
