Uniform


- All children must present in the correct uniform each day.
- Please label all items of uniform including ties and shoes.
- Hair conventionally cut with no visible lines. Appropriate length (not shaven or less than grade 2). Shoulder length hair should be tied back at all times using a bow or bobble. Highlights/Lowlights are not permitted. Small bows or hair bands may be worn.
- Earrings are not permitted.
- Please bring a water bottle each day and remember to take these home each day to be cleaned.

Class Saint

Each class has a representative Class Saint who guides us and inspires us during the year.

Our class Saint is St Maximillian Kolbe.

His Feast Day is 14th August. We will arrange a date to celebrate this in term time.



Curriculum

- RE is taught at least twice a week. The Catholic Faith with its values and virtues run through and underpin the whole curriculum.
- Mathematics and English are taught daily.
- Each half term/term, we will study a book which will drive our writing forward. Autumn – Holes by Louis Sachar.
- The first activity of the day is Arithmetic based. This is completed as soon as the children sit down at the start of the day hence the importance of punctuality.
- Guided Reading is taught daily and focuses on comprehension, inference, finding and recording evidence and making links across texts.
- Children will use enquiry based learning in all foundation subject areas

Curriculum

Each half term, we will have a new topics to focus on in Year 6 to inspire our learning across the curriculum. We will read lots of books and carryout cross-curricular activities that help us to embed out learning in these topics. Our curriculum overview is on our class page of the website.

This year, we will focus on the following areas:

Autumn 1

History – Crime and Punishment (changes in an aspect of social history from 1066)

Science – Living Things and their habitats

Autumn 2

Geography – Do I know my way around the world?

Science- Evolution and Inheritance

Spring 1

History – If WW1 was the war to end all wars why was there a WW2?

Science - Light

Spring 2

Geography - Can I locate and describe deserts? Do I understand the importance of our ports?

Science – Electricity

Summer 1

History – A study of the Benin Civilisation Science – Animals including humans

Summer 2

Geography – What is the difference between the developed world and the third world? (CAFOD) Science – Animals including humans

Daily Homework

Children are expected to read everyday and have their diary signed by an adult every day. This is checked daily and dojos are added for each day that they have read at home.

Children are expected to practise their times tables and spellings daily. These will be checked and tested weekly.

Our Mission Statement is:

It is important all our children know the mission statement and school rules and can talk about them when discussing positive and negative behaviour.

Daily Rewards – dojos

Children are awarded Dojos for positive workrelated behaviour such as reading at home, producing a good piece of work in class, trying hard in lessons etc.

Dojos are left to accumulate throughout the year. Children will receive a special certificate when they reach 100, 200 or 300 dojos

Negative dojos are issued for negative behaviour, which breaks one or more of our four school rules.

Daily Rewards – House Points

Children are awarded house points for demonstrating the school rules in their thoughts, words and actions.

The house team with the most points will be celebrated in assembly every two weeks.

P.E

Children will have 2 hours of P.E every week.

Our PE Day is Friday each week.

For this half term, children are expected to come to school with their PE kit in a kit bag. All children must have correct school PE kit in school on PE days. This includes suitable footwear and clothing that follows school guidelines and is suitable for the weather.

P.E days may change each half term.

Sacramental preparation Confirmation

Y6 are prepared for Confirmation through our R.E units across the academic year.

This includes learning about:

- The sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation
- Saints and choosing their own saints name.

Monday Morning

- ▶ Please arrive at school at the usual time.
- Suitcases/Holdalls/Rucksacks can be taken into the classrooms
- Any medication must be handed to Mrs Forrester and included on the medical form.
- ► What you bring you will carry please avoid bringing too large a case/holdall. **Bedding is not needed.**
- ► The Stanley Head minibuses will take the children to Stanley Head. They will pick them up from the drop off car park.

Friday Afternoon

Children will return to school during the afternoon.

 Parents may collect children from school on return at approx. 2.15pm from the main reception

 A message will be sent out if for any reason this changes.

- The itinerary could be subject to change but is a guide as to what activities the children will be doing each day.

Contact

Children can NOT take mobile phones.



 Parents will only be contacted by telephone should a problem arise.

• We will endeavour to send general messages through the school text system each day to let you know what the children have been doing. There will be no set time for these.

Equipment

- ➤ You will be given a kit list with the types of clothing needed please label where possible
- All bedding (duvets, pillows and sheets) is provided - the children don't need to take any.
- ► You <u>must</u> take a mug (hot chocolate in the evening)
- One packet of biscuits only
- You should take a torch.
- Girls no straighteners! Hairdryers allowed ideally share.
- ▶ Please no deodorants/aerosols
- ▶ No i-phones/i-pads or any other electrical devices.

Equipment

► Teddies are allowed!

> Small games, books, cards, word searches, notepads are ideal.

► Try not to take too much - and encourage your son/daughter to keep their belongings safe and organised. Let them pack with you so that they know what they have taken.

Food

- ► The food at Stanley Head is varied, nutritious and healthy.
- ► Any dietary needs will be catered for.
- The children choose their meals the day before (tick their choices) and there is a huge selection. All tastes are catered for!
- ▶ Please bring a pack of biscuits to share with the class (and staff!) with our hot chocolate at night. (Please no biscuits containing nuts)
- No other snacks (crisps, sweets, chocolate, chewing gum) or drinks are allowed

In Loco Parentis

- *This means that the trip leaders assume the role of the parent for the week.
- * It is our responsibility to act as a responsible parent for the week.
- * If there was a need to contact parents, we would not hesitate to do so.
- * There will be a Loco Parentis form for you to sign which gives permission for us to administer medicine if needed, such as paracetamol, insect bite relief.

Medical Needs

- You will be given a medical questionnaire to fill in closer to departure (1 week before) No Slip...No Trip!
- Children must NOT carry their own medication. This MUST be given to Mrs Forrester on the Monday morning (Please check age limits, best before dates etc.
- Children with relief inhalers will need to keep these with them at all times
- If there is anything else we need to know, please speak to staff after the meeting or before the trip. (This will be treated with the strictest confidence.)

Behaviour

Although Stanley Head have their rules, St. Wilfrid's expects the highest standards of behaviour. Should your child not behave to these standards, you will be asked to collect your child and then they will attend school as normal. Should Stanley Head choose to send your child home, the same rules apply. We want all children to enjoy themselves and we know that they will, safely.
