Curriculum Information: Year 6 - Summer Term

Holy Week

- Children know the story of the passion of Jesus in some detail.
- They will be able to imagine some of the thoughts and feelings of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane and think of some reasons why Peter denied Jesus.
- They will know some words of Jesus from the cross and understand why the death of Jesus has been described as a sacrifice.

Easter

- Children will know the story of the appearance of the Risen Christ to Thomas; understand some reasons why he failed to believe that Christ was alive, providing possible answers; and describe how this meeting changed his life.
- They will know some New Testament stories that speak about eternal life and understand that Christians believe in eternal life.
- They will identify symbols from the Baptismal and funeral liturgy and understand how they recall in a special way the death and Resurrection of Christ and the promise of eternal life.

Pentecost

- The children will compare and contrast the two New Testament stories about the coming of the Holy Spirit
- They will understand why wind, fire and breath are important symbols of the Holy Spirit.
- The children will know the names of the Gifts and Fruits of the Holy Spirit and can demonstrate in many ways their presence and importance in the lives of Christians.

Prayers in the Lives of the Followers of Christ

 Children know a range of traditional prayers used by the Church and be able to discuss the meaning of the words contained in them.


Biology: Evolution and Inheritance
