Uniform

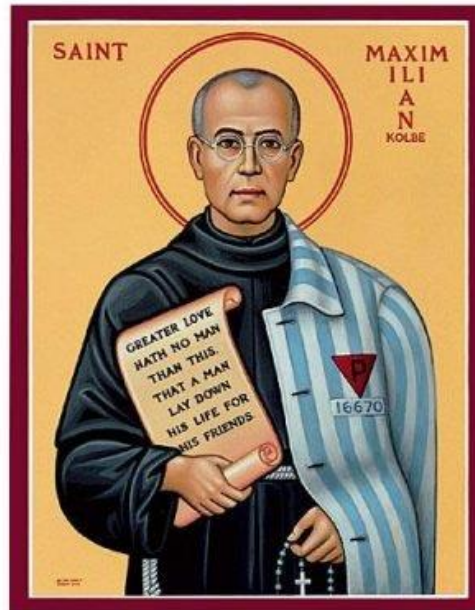
- All children must present in the correct uniform each day.
- Please label all items of uniform including ties and shoes.
- Hair should be conventionally cut with no visible lines.
Appropriate length
Shoulder length hair should be tied back at all times using a small bow or bobble (in school colours) .
- Earrings are not permitted and parents will be asked to remove them should their child attend school wearing earrings.
- An appropriate sized water bottle is needed each day labelled with your child's name. Water bottles must be filled with water only.

Class Saint

Each class has a representative Class Saint who guides us and inspires us during the year.

Our class Saint is St Maximilian Kolbe.

We will celebrate his feast day on Monday 27th January.



Curriculum

- RE is taught at least twice a week.
- Mathematics, English and Reading are taught daily.
- Each term, we will study a book which will inspire our writing.
- The first activity of the day is fluency based. This is completed as soon as the children sit down at the start of the day hence the importance of punctuality.



The impact of reading at home

It's hard to overstate the impact of reading with your child at home. Research shows that regular reading at home leads to:

- Higher levels of literacy
- Widened vocabulary
- Improved mental wellbeing
- Higher levels of empathy
- A stronger sense of imagination
- Improved sleeping patterns

One key study found that a child who is read one book a day will hear 290,000 more words by age 5 than a child who doesn't regularly read with a parent or caregiver. As a result, these children have a huge advantage when it comes to starting school.

It's not just about literacy though – taking time to read with a child tells them that they are important and deserving of attention. This has positive effects on confidence and self-esteem.

KS1 Reading

- Each week, children will bring home a Bug Club phonics book. This book will be 100% decodable- meaning children should know ALL of the sounds within the book. They should be able to read on sight or blend and segment to read. This is to develop fluency, accuracy and reading for meaning.
- Children will also be able to access a different book on their Pearson online account if they wish to complete further reading.
- Children will be bringing home an additional book with a black label. This is a story book to share to spark discussion, imagination and inspire a love of reading. Children may wish to join in when reading but they are not expected to decode these books as they may contain sounds that they have not been taught yet.



KS2 Reading

- Children are expected to read 5 nights per week at home. Parents are expected to sign their child's each night to show they have read.
- Each week your child will bring home a book that matches their current level of reading.
- They will also bring home a book from our school library which they have chosen themselves.

Curriculum

Each half term, we will have a new learning focus in Year 6 to inspire our learning across the curriculum.

This term, we will focus on the following areas in our History and Geography units:

Autumn 1: Crime and Punishment

Autumn 2: Deserts

Daily Homework

Reading & Morning Maths questions

Spellings should be practised at home regularly - tested weekly.

Weekly Homework

Each week homework will need to be returned to school on Tuesday. It will be given out every Thursday.

Daily Rewards - Achievement points

Children are awarded achievement points daily for following the school rules.

This can be monitored by parents on the new school app.

Certificates in assembly for reaching 100, 200 and 300 achievement points

Points contribute towards their house's total at the end of each week.

P.E

Our PE Day is Thursday.

Children are expected to come to school with their PE kit in a kit bag.
We encourage children to leave their PE kits in school during the week.

All children must have correct school PE kit in school on PE days. This includes suitable footwear and clothing that follows school guidelines and is suitable for the weather.

P.E days may change each half term .

Sacramental preparation

Year 6 is a special time for the children as they prepare for Confirmation. Children prepare for this special sacrament during school time but attending Mass regularly will be an expectation to help them prepare and grow stronger in their understanding of their faith.
